#### Chaplain's Message


Father Voisin



1967 Joe Zinger gets the idea that Maryhill could have a splendid K of C Council

1968 Charter is received January 3 and the Council is named after Monsignor Foerster who was pastor of St. Boniface parish for 46 years, Established Columbian Squires, Formed the Corporation Board in October,

1969 Completed construction of the Hall facility, The monthly draw was established. The official opening in September was dedicated by Bishop Ryan of Hamilton, Conducted our own first Degree and on December 8th held the first Christmas party.

1970 Bob Steel was named the new District Deputy and he supervised the installation of officers, Established the second Thursday of the month as the executive meetings, Br. Matt Eichorn organized a walkathon to finance the first ball diamond.
